KENTON COUNTY FAIR

July 15-20,2024

4-H'ers have the opportunity to showcase their project work and skills at the county fair. This week-long event is full of shows and activities for 4-H'ers and their families. Project work that is entered into the fair is displayed during the week at the 4-H building.



4-H projects are awarded ribbons based on the "Danish System." This is a judging system where the project is not compared to others in its class but to an ideal standard. Youth are awarded a blue, red or white ribbon based on how close the project approaches this standard. The best entry in the class is considered the champion and receives a purple ribbon and is eligible for the state fair. Please note: Energy, Weather, County Only Sewing and Miscellaneous categories are county only, and do not advance to the state fair. Therefore, no purple or champion ribbons will be awarded in these categories.

DROPPING OFF PROJECTS Sunday, July 14, 2024; 1-3 pm

Projects can be dropped off from 1 to 3 p.m. on Sunday, July 14th. The 4-H Building is the first building on your right as you walk up the hill from the parking area. Your first stop will be at the check in table set in the entrance of the building. This is drop off only, you must register your projects on line by Monday, July 8. Once checked in, you will go to the appropriate area with each project. Judging will occur immediately following check in. Any individual who cannot make the Sunday drop off should make arrangements with their club leader for entering their projects. Contact one of the agents if you have any questions.

STEP INTO NATURE, SUMMER EDITION

School is out, and the sun is up in the sky! You may have lots of plans for how you want to spend your summer break, or not many plans at all. Whether you are planning a big trip, staying busy with camps, or have plenty of time to relax at home, spend some time outside this summer.



Maybe you like to Splash at the pool, Unwind on a hammock, Make forts in your backyard, or Mow the lawn for your family. Perhaps you Enjoy a picnic in the shade or Ride your bike with friends. There are so many ways to step outside and into nature!



Your body needs to move for at least one hour each day. Moving helps your bones and muscles grow and helps your whole body feel its best. We were made to move, and being active is easy outside! When you run, jump, climb, swing, and play, you are helping your muscles and bones get stronger and more stable. Is there a skill that you can't quite do just yet? Maybe a handstand or shooting a 3-point shot in basketball? The more you use your muscles and practice those skills, the better you'll get.

Your brain also benefits when you spend time outside in nature. Whether you are climbing a tree, sitting in the grass, or hiking on a trail in the woods, being outdoors helps our bodies feel calmer, be able to pay attention more, and feel happier. If you have a bad day, or feel sad or upset, try spending some time outside: playing, reading, or just resting on the ground.

When you go outside, it is also important to protect yourself from too much sun. Remember things like:

Kenton County 4-H Council Agricultural Scholarship Program

Scholarships will be awarded for 2024:

\$1,000 - \$1,500 From the Bi-County Coop Agricultural Evolvement Fund

The following requirements apply to scholarship:

- 1. Applicants must have a high school graduation date of 2024.
- 2. Applicant must be a full-time Kentucky resident.
- 3. Applicant must have been an active Kenton County 4-H member for at least the current and past three (3) years (the current year 2024, 2023, 2022) an active participant in an agricultural related project.

Applicant must attend a post-secondary academic or vocational institution and be a full-time student, consideration given to the program of study.

Application Process:

Applications available at the Kenton County Extension office and on the Kenton County 4-H website at www.kentoncountyextension.org. All applications must_be electronically submitted by e-mail to dkelley@uky.edu on or by Thursday, September 5, 2024, in order to be considered. Scholarship winners will be announced and recognized during the Kenton County 4-H Recognition Event in October.

COUNTY FAIR 4-H MEMBER PASSES

Available at Extension Office

The fair board allows us to distribute passes for entrance into the Kenton County Fair to 4-H members at a cost of \$7.00 each, with a limit of 6 passes per enrolled 4-H'er. These passes do not include rides and are for 4-H youth only and not siblings or parents. They will be available, Monday, July 1, 2024, at the Durr Extension Office on Taylor Mill Road between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, until Thursday, July 18. They will also be available Sunday, July 14, at the 4-H Check-in Booth at the Kenton County Fairgrounds from 1-3 p.m. Checks (payable to Kenton County Fair) or correct change is requested.

TRAVELING WITH 4-H MEMBERS

When 4-H members travel with their 4-H leader to an event or activity, 4-H'ers should provide a completed 4-H Event Code of Conduct form, a Participant Information form, and the Medical Information form, to the 4-H leader providing transportation. These forms provide useful information to the leader in the event a 4-H member cannot communicate what the 4-H

leader needs to know. The forms should be returned to the parent/ guardian after the activity. Forms may be re-used. 4-H Leaders may request copies from the Kenton County Extension. Office as needed.
