

#### DURR FOUNDATION 4-H SCHOLARSHIP— KENTON DEADLINE IS MARCH 15, 2024

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- Students must be incoming freshmen at any Kentucky College or University which gives a 2 year or 4 year degree.
- Recipients must be high school graduates from a school in one of the following counties and must have been active members in a 4-H program in that county for the last four years: Boone, Bracken, Campbell, Carroll, Gallatin, Grant, Harrison, Kenton, Mason, Owen, Pendleton, or Robertson.
- 3. Applicants must have maintained a 2.0 GPA in their last two years of high school.
- 4. Applicants will submit their high school transcripts.
- Applicants will also submit two letters of recommendation, one from an extension agent and one from a counselor, teacher or principal.
- 6. Applicants will submit on a separate sheet of paper an essay stating why you would like to be the recipient of this scholarship. Include in your essay your interests and/or goals for the future. The essay is limited to two (2) double spaced pages using a 12 point font and one (1) inch margins.
- Student must fill out the application and be willing to appear before a committee for an interview if needed.

Each scholarship is now \$3,000 per year with the scholarship automatically renewing for the student's sophomore year if the student maintains a 2.0 grade point average which would increase the total scholarship value to \$6,000.

You access the application at: www.DurrFoundation.com. Go to the Application page and hit the Apply button at the bottom of the page. Students will need to set up a password with an email address. They will also need the access code: 2024 in order to get the application. Once you hit the submit button, you will no longer be able to edit your application but you may enter data over several sessions until you submit.





#### **State Horse Updates**

The State Horse Show is scheduled for August 5-10, 2024 at the Kentucky State Fairgrounds.

The State Horse Contests will be June 6 & 7—Martin Gatton College of Agriculture

The Qualification system for the 2024 State Show will be same as for 2023, which is to attend a horse show or horsemanship clinic, and provide proof to your leader/agent.

The Educational hours deadline is June 5.

Horse Eligibility Form deadline is June 20.

Multiple horses can be used in shows. All horses need to qualify and have correct paperwork on file.

#### **Kentucky Forest Leadership Program**

Are you interested in the environment and want to know more about forests, trees, insects, water and wildlife? Then consider the Kentucky Forest Leadership Program where you can explore the many aspects of forestry and related fields. If you like hands-on learning in the great outdoors this program is for you. This



week-long, residential program is for high school students completing their sophomore and junior years.

The Kentucky Forest Leadership Program offers three educational tracks:

- <u>Forestry</u> students will learn about tree and plant identification, forest evaluation and management, soil and water quality and fire management in Kentucky's forests.
- <u>Entomology</u> students will learn about insect identification, collection, preservation and ecology. They will also learn about the positive and negative impacts insects can have on Kentucky's forests.
- Wildlife students will gain experience with different techniques to sample, identify and manage wildlife as well as conducting species diversity and population surveys in various Kentucky habitats.
